

# Workforce for Student Well-being Project ECHO

January 2025 | Ten, 75-Minute Sessions

The Workforce for Student Well-being (WSW) ECHO is a virtual learning network designed for school social workers to interface with each other and a team of experts across Washington. Starting in January 2025, the WSW Project ECHO will feature ten 75-minute sessions on key topics.

Participation in the Workforce for Student Wellbeing (WSW) Project ECHO is free and will provide group clinical supervision for participants. **The ECHO model** is based on building interdisciplinary teams, amplification of resources, and sharing best practices. ECHO sessions include brief didactic lectures and case-based engagement, with dedicated session time for Q&A and discussion. Project ECHO is different from the traditional webinar, where information is shared in one direction from the subject matter expert to participants. Entrenched in the concept of “All Teach, All Learn”, information flow in an ECHO session is expected to be bidirectional, where participants learn not only from subject matter experts but from each other as they share their own experiences and expertise.

## Learning Objectives:

- **Crisis Intervention and Mental Health Support:** Equip school social workers with the skills to effectively manage student crises and address mental health issues within the school environment.
- **Culturally Responsive Practices:** Develop expertise in implementing culturally responsive approaches to address racial and ethnic disparities and improve outcomes for diverse student populations.
- **Collaboration and Advocacy:** Strengthen the ability to collaborate with school staff, families, and community partners, and effectively advocate for student needs.

## Who can participate?

Previous students who have completed WSW training, practicum instructors who have overseen a WSW student, and members of WASSW. Participate in sessions every other week
