

# Workforce for Student Well-being ECHO Invitation to Join as HUB Content Expert

January 2025 | Ten, 75-Minute Sessions

The Workforce for Student Wellbeing (WSW) ECHO is a virtual network designed to connect school social workers across Washington with each other and a team of experts. Developed by Dr. Sanjeev Arora at the [University of New Mexico](#) in 2003, the ECHO model has expanded globally, now encompassing fields like education and social work. WSW ECHO, one of over 1,000 global hubs, offers free group clinical supervision to reduce barriers to clinical licensure. Beginning in January 2025, the WSW Project ECHO will feature ten 75-minute sessions focused on implementing school mental health supports and strategies for connecting home, school, and community.

Each session will include a brief lecture followed by a de-identified case presentation or group discussion, fostering a collaborative environment where participants and HUB members share their expertise and engage in discussions. HUB members, as content experts, will support the ECHO by selecting session topics, delivering content, and enriching the learning experience.

## The series will cover topics such as:

- Evidence-based practices.
- Early screening and intervention.
- Culturally responsive approaches to addressing racial and ethnic disparities.
- Postvention supports.
- Other topics identified by HUB members.

## HUB Team Members Responsibilities

- Attending planning meetings.
- Selecting session topics.
- Delivering didactic content.
- Presenting case studies.

The multidisciplinary HUB team is integral to the success of the ECHO process. Beyond participating in the scheduled ECHO sessions, HUB team members actively contribute to planning and supporting the series. This includes attending planning meetings, selecting session topics, delivering didactic content, and sharing case studies. HUB members may also lead 1-2 didactic presentations and case studies throughout the series.

The initial HUB planning will be completed before sessions begin. We will share the series topics and schedule in advance for your review and input, ensuring that everyone's expertise is incorporated. HUB team members are encouraged to submit ideas for session topics and are expected to present at least one case study on a topic of their choice. Additionally, we ask that everyone logs in 10 minutes before each ECHO session and stays for a 10-minute debrief afterward, allowing us to reflect and learn together.

We are excited to invite you to the HUB planning group and welcome your knowledge and expertise. We look forward to collaborating with you to create a successful WSW ECHO series!
